Re: Statement from Mayor Harper on the passing of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

The Town of Nipawin's flags are currently at half-mast in remembrance of the victims of the attacks that occurred at the communities of James Smith Cree Nation and the Village of Weldon. The flags are being lowered one day for each life lost. Now that His Majesty's Accession was proclaimed, the flags were raised and then lowered again until the day of Her Majesty's funeral service. Following that, flags will remain at half-mast until each life lost at James Smith Cree Nation and Weldon has been acknowledged.
