Beginning with the 2012 Municipal Election, terms are 4 years for Mayor and Councillors.

 Election Day: 4th Wednesday of October.

Election Officials are required to attend a mandatory training session prior to the election and will be paid \$25.00 remuneration for attending. (**September 26, 2015 Council Meeting**)

Election Campaign Signs (R):

Campaign signs for candidates in Federal, Provincial and Municipal Elections are permitted on Town-owned vacant lots only and on Town boulevards subject to the following conditions:

- signs shall not exceed a face area of .60 sq. Meters.
- signs must be placed in a manner so as not to create an obstruction to vehicle or pedestrian traffic or a hazard to public safety.
- Signs on boulevards must be set back 4.0 meters from the corner where the street lines intersect.
- Signs are restricted to a height not exceeding 1.0 meters.
- Signs are prohibited on centre medians.
- Signs must be removed within 7 days following Election Day.

(Nov. 14, 2000 Council Meeting)

Placement of election campaign signs is prohibited on power poles, street light standards or traffic-related signs and poles that are located in the centre medians or traffic islands for placement of signs. (Dec. 11, 2000 Council Meeting)

Mail-In Voting:

Beginning in 2012, Mail in Voting will be utilized (Bylaw 934/12).

Voters must register in person with the Town Office no later than 10 days prior to the election.

Voter's List:

Voters' List not required (Bylaw 161/68).
